Musing On The Scriptures

Psalm 91:1-16- To dwell means: to sit, to live in, to remain. When it comes to the presence of the LORD are you visiting occasionally or living with Him? How has His presence protected you and provided for you in the past? Do you still trust Him to deliver and provide for you in the future? If so, does your proximity to Him show that? Lately have you been far from Him or close?

Hebrews 10:5-38- Christ became the final sacrifice for our sins. He shed His blood, died and rose to redeem and set us apart unto the Father and Himself. What does this say about His love for you? You have been justified/ made righteous by Christ. What does this say about your new identity? You have been made welcome to come into the holy of holies to be with Yah. Are you repenting in prayer to be made right or just making requests?

Proverbs 27:1-14- The light and salvation of Yah is over His little ones. He protects all who are in His fold. What are the things in your life that create fear and self confidence? How often do you get a chance to just enjoy God and anticipate your future with Him? Is Christ your primary focus?

Give Thanks for A Heart to Repent

Pride and fear are the two things that lead us into having a sinful perspective on life. The enemy wants us to trust in ourselves instead of Christ. Satan loves it when we are consumed by fear and confused about who we are. He knows that when we take our eyes off of Yeshua we are more prone to error. As Christians we must keep our eyes on the LORD. We must meditate on His word day and night. We must walk in an intimacy that gives us authority over the evil one and the desire to walk in the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5). Know that God has more in store for His church.
